This project brings together six partners from three European countries - France, Belgium and Italy - involved in the social economy and work-based integration. Thanks to this experience of collaboration, we have made progress in the creation of innovative resources aimed at helping low-skilled adults find sustainable employment.

### A look back at the latest developments:

Since our last issue, the ACTION team has taken some decisive steps forward. The project's four key results are now being finalised and even released:

- The profile of the integration counselor
- A guide of the integration pathway
- A logbook for the integration worker
- A toolbox for guidance towards employment

Piloting activities have been carried out on these initial tools, and feedback from users has already led to significant improvements. This participative approach is essential to ensure that the resources are practical and adapted to the needs of fields professionals and the people they support.

## Transnational meeting in Lyon, France



Last 3 and 4 October, the partners met in Lyon for a **steering committee meeting**. The meeting provided an opportunity to make progress towards finalising the project's outcomes, and to work particularly on the fourth and final outcome: the toolkit for guidance towards employment.

The meeting also gave the partners an insight into the reality of work-based integration in France, with 3 field visits across 3 different sectors of activity: Le Grand Barnum integration hotel, transport mediation by Médialys and recycling at Envie Rhône.

The work we've been doing over the last few months has paid off: **the Profile of Integration Counsellors is now online!** This resource, which introduces the three that will follow, **lays the foundations of support for target groups**: who is involved, what are the related tasks and activities, which practices to draw on and which to avoid, etc.
