

An overview of the ACTION project:

Inclusion through economic activity enables low-skilled adults who are far from employment to get back on their feet, via special contracts for reintegrated workers. In the integration structures, they benefit from appropriate support on the job. The people who support them on the ground - the **insertion counsellors** - multiply their experience and resources to meet a multidimensional challenge: on-the-job training and technical support on the one hand, and psychosocial follow-up and job coaching on the other.

Thanks to the results that will be produced, ACTION aims to **improve support for reintegrated workers** and to develop the methodology of work-based integration as an innovative and integrated response to the needs of these people and to contemporary social and economic issues.



And concretely?

The project aims to develop four useful results:

1. Profile of the insertion counsellor
2. Methodological guide of the insertion pathway
3. Individualised training plan
4. Toolkit for job coaching

Some news from the project:

The project started in February 2022, and since then the partners have met face-to-face on two occasions. First in Brussels for the project launch meeting, then in Ancona at the end of the year for the second project meeting.

Collaboration and work are well underway, as are the discussions. The partners will soon conclude the first result of the project, by drawing up the missions and challenges faced by the "insertion counsellors". The results of the discussion and research are being compiled and analysed in a production report which should be available shortly.

In addition, the partners are also making progress on the second output of the project, the methodological guide of the insertion pathway.



This result will present the key steps of the integration pathway, as well as good practices to implement them. This work should be completed by the end of 2023.

In the near future, the preparatory work for the development of the third output of the project will be launched. This will consist of a tool for monitoring the skills and training needs of reintegrated workers.
